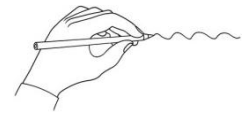

Do you know about Frida Kahlo, the famous Mexican artist? Practise your reading in English with this biography.

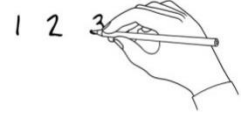

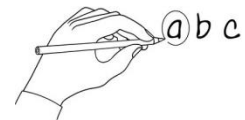
