It makes me feel a little bit stupid and sad and a bit angry as well.

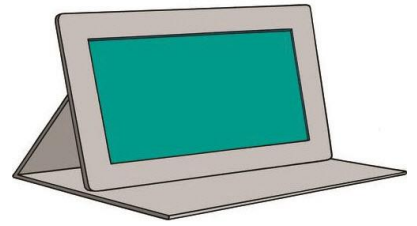
Annoyed.
