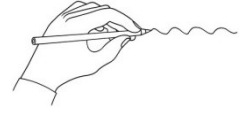

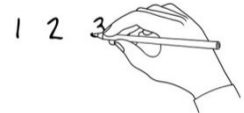
Match the words with the definitions.

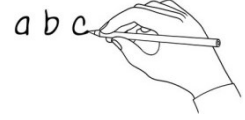
